

In order to apply for one of our ideation grants, you will have to fill in a form with 14 questions. Here is a preview of what you will be asked:

Section 1. First, we will make sure that you are eligible to receive funding from Multitudes Foundation.

1. In order to be eligible, you must be located, planning to operate in and have access to a registered bank account in any of the following countries: Albania, Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Kosovo, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Moldova, Montenegro, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Cyprus, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, UK, Ukraine.

Section 2. Then, we will ask you some questions to get to know you better.

2. Name

3. Surname

4. Pronouns (optional)

5. Phone number

6. Can you provide examples of your involvement in people-powered initiatives, community organising, or electoral politics? How has this experience contributed to your understanding of the issue you want to tackle? (1200 characters max)

7. What is your positionality or positionalities? (600 characters max)

Section 3. Finally, we will ask you about your plans.

8. We understand you probably don't know yet exactly what your idea will turn into. Still, we want to make sure that your idea would fit within our three areas of work. Please choose the categories you think are closer to the initiative you want to build:

- Build more inclusive and human political cultures. (Examples. Initiatives that work with or address political parties regarding how they select their electoral list, initiatives that build inclusive environments, ...)
- Find effective ways for people and communities to mobilise and build political power. (Examples. initiatives that plan to support people and communities to build power between and during elections; initiatives that provide the

infrastructure for people to organise and mobilise to change who holds power, how it is exercised, and how people connect to it)

- Prepare new political leaders to run for office and make a difference. (Examples. Initiatives that plan to identify and support candidates—particularly those from underrepresented communities—to run for political office and/or support them once they are in office)

9. What are the issues you want to address and how does your idea/approach contribute to one or more of our funding categories mentioned in the previous question? Tell us about your motivation as well as the political landscape, challenges and opportunities of the field you plan to work on *(1500 characters)*
10. What is the primary target group you plan to work with? Why is it important to support this group in particular? *(1200 characters)*
11. How does your idea address the root causes of the issues we face in society or politics? (i.e., structural discrimination, inequality, etc.) *(1200 characters)*
12. How does your idea aim to overcome structural [barriers to representation in politics as identified in our research](#)? *(1200 characters)*
13. How does your idea contribute to a new type of political leadership and culture? *(1200 characters)*
14. How are principles of equity and justice embedded in your approach? *(1200 characters)*
